Call for Special Sessions/Minisymposia at AMMCS-2019

- Plan to attend for scientific networking and interdisciplinary communication with your peers.
- Plan to attend for plenary and invited talks given by outstanding scientists and mathematicians.
- Plan to attend for many exciting special and contributed sessions.

To submit a new session/minisymposium, organizers should send an e-mail to ammcs@wlu.ca with the following information:

- The title of the minisymposium/session;
- The name(s) of the organizer(s);
- A brief description (about 100 words).

While planning your minisymposium/special session, please note that

- Minisymposia will consist of several 2 hour sessions.
- Special sessions have usually 6 talks (20 minutes each).
- One registered participant has a limit of two talks at the meeting.

For AMMCS special sessions' and minisymposia's organizers registration fee is waived.

The AMMCS Conference Series aims at promoting interdisciplinary research and collaboration involving mathematical, statistical and computational sciences within a larger international community. It focuses on recent advances in Applied Mathematics, Modeling and Computational Science (AMMCS) and brings together the researchers from many different disciplines. The last conference in this series was held in 2017. A large event was held in 2015 where the AMMCS conference brought together around 600 researchers from around the world, representing six continents. It was organized jointly with CAIMS. The AMMCS-2019 interdisciplinary conference is the Vth conference in this series. It will feature many distinguished plenary speakers, contributed and invited papers, as well as special sessions, covering the latest scientific advances and AMMCS successes in a variety of fields.

Special Sessions/Minisymposia at AMMCS-2019

Additional Information

Established scientists, mathematicians, engineers and practitioners are invited to organize special sessions (SS) and Minisymposia (MS) in all areas of the conference, including mathematical and computational sciences, modeling and simulation, as well as their applications in natural and social sciences, engineering and technology, industry and finance.

We encourage participation of research teams from all parts of the world and submissions in new emerging areas of AMMCS.

It is recommended that each SS/MS has at least two, but no more than four, organizers. All SS/MS proposals should be submitted to the AMMCS-2019 Organizing Committee at ammcs@wlu.ca as soon as possible (with the final deadline of February 22, 2019). Please note that proposals will be considered on an ongoing basis. ***Further things to note:***

- For practical reason, each SS/MS should have a Corresponding Organizer, who will submit the proposal and will be the main contact person for the Organizing Committee.
- The backbone of SS/MS will consist of established researchers in their respective fields, but we encourage also inviting young researchers such as postdoctoral students and students.
- Each SS will be organized in a 2 hour block and will usually have 6 presentations of 20 minutes each.
- Each MS will have at least 2 Sessions. A Minisymposium cannot be split in parallel sessions.
- For Minisymposia of at least 3 Sessions, the MS Organizers have the possibility to propose a Semi-Plenary Lecture (for the speaker giving such a lecture registration fee is waived and local accommodation plus economy class travel expenses within North America are paid). Since Sessions are subdivided into 20 minutes slots, the format in this case will consist of one Semi-Plenary Lecture of one hour duration plus 3 invited papers of 20 minutes each.
- For all SS/MS organizers registration fee is waived.
- The list of prospective speakers is not required at the time of proposal submission. The Corresponding Organizer of accepted SS/MS should provide the AMMCS-2019 Organizing Committee with such a list by March 15, 2019.
